Notifying Residents of Emergencies and Urgent Matters - Email Address Collection

TRASH AND RECYCLING CONTAINERS

The community looks better when containers are in their storage location, not on the streets. Place them at the curb the night before after 7 p.m. and return them by Monday evening.



Rules and Regulations.

The Arrowhead Rules and Regulations have been established to maintained a beautiful and harmonious community. They are periodically revised to address new issues and to provide more options for homeowners while keeping the community beautiful. Recycling - What is Permitted and Not

Permitted:

Plastic bottles and containers with a number 1 - 7 in triangle

Glass bottles and jars

Aluminum and metal cans and lids Cartons: milk, juice and broth

Paper: newspaper, junk mail and cardboard

Not Permitted: Styrofoam Pizza boxes Paper plates Shredded paper

Toys, scrap metal, hangers, wire, plastics and hoses

Cardboard Recycling - Upper Dublin Township Requirements

Flatten all boxes before placing them in the recycling container.

Cardboard should be in the container with the lid closed

Do not leave cardboard outside the container unless you have scheduled an extra pick up. If you have scheduled an extra pickup, the cardboard outside the container should be flattened and tied together. To schedule an extra pickup, call the township – 215-643-1600.



Trash Pick-up Days

Trash and recycling are picked up by the township each Monday with the following exceptions which are township holidays: MLK day (1/16/23), Presidents' Day (2/20/23), Memorial Day (5/29/23), Labor Day (9/4/23), Columbus Day (10/10/22) (10/9/23) and Christmas (12/26/22) (12/25/23). The alternate day is Wednesday. All trash and recycling must be in the containers.

Additional Trash Pickup on Wednesday is available for \$10.00 (call township to arrange). **Large Item (bulk) Pickup** can be arranged with the township for a fee (216-643-1600 Ext 0).

Pet Waste

Please pick up after your pet to keep our community beautiful. There is a dog waste station with plastic waste bags and a waste disposal container on Arrowhead Trail near the playground. The Board is considering installing another dog waste station on Arrowhead Trail near the large grass area by Tennis Avenue. DUMPING IN WOODED AREAS OF COMMUNITY

Please do not dispose of things in the wooded areas of our community, such as grass clippings, dead plants or bushes, food waste or any other items, it greatly detracts from the beauty of the community. Place grass clippings in your yard waste container. The township will compost them.







HOLIDAY DECORATIONS

Holiday decorations are permitted to be installed 30 days prior to a holiday and removed 21 days following the holiday. Inflatable decorations are permitted during holidays. They shall not exceed 8 feet in height and not obstruct neighbor's property.



Hazardous Waste Collection

Christmas Tree Collections

Christmas trees will be collected after the holiday on the following trash days: Wednesday 1/4 (Monday – holiday), Monday 1/9 and Wednesday 1/18 (Monday – holiday). Place trees at the curb with all decorations removed and NOT in a plastic bag.



SNOW REMOVAL

Snow is removed from the community when more than 2 inches is expected. The order of snow clearing is: streets first, followed by common walkways, visitor parking spots, contemporary home driveways and homeowner parking spots last. After streets and visitor parking spots are cleared, move your cars to the visitor parking spots or along Arrowhead Trail. This will open up the homeowner parking spots to be cleared. If you see the small snow plow vehicle on your street, let your neighbors know that they should move their vehicles. If two inches or less of snow is received, residents are responsible to remove snow and ice from the walkway of their house and the common sidewalk in front and on the side of their house. If salt is used to melt ice, use calcium chloride, not sodium chloride which causes damage to concrete.

FIRE SAFETY TIPS



Smoke Alarms

The township requires a smoke alarm on each level of a house. They should be hard-wired with a back-up battery in case of a power failure. They should be tested monthly, cleaned yearly (vacuum or blow out the dust) and the battery replaced each year.



Carbon Monoxide Alarms

Any type of combustion (burning) produces carbon monoxide which is a deadly, colorless, odorless and poisonous gas. Homes should have a carbon monoxide alarm in the immediate area of bedroom doors (within 15 feet of each door) or installed in each bedroom. Carbon monoxide alarms can be battery powered or a plug-in type. They should be tested monthly, cleaned yearly and the battery replaced yearly. If the device activates, remove everyone from the house and call the fire company.



Fire Protection for Arrowhead

The Fort Washington fire company provides fire protection for our community. They are staffed by volunteers. Donations enable them to purchase new equipment and maintain existing equipment.
